

A dash can be used to separate two main clauses indicating that the two sentences are linked to each other. Just a reminder...



A main clause contains one idea or event, a verb and <u>always</u> makes sense on its own.



Avoid using dashes in this way in formal writing.



Dashes show the reader that there is a pause in the sentence that is longer than for a comma but shorter than for a full stop.



There was a beach, a pool and crazy golf. It was the best holiday ever!

There was a beach, a pool and crazy golf - it was the best holiday ever!

Swimming is a great form of exercise. I try to swim 20 lengths of our local pool every day!

Top tip! Don't over-use dashes in your writing. Mix them up with conjunctions and semi-colons in place of the pause.
