- ✓ The text introducing the list of bullet points should end with a colon.
- ✓ A verb (is, are etc.)
 should not be used
 before the colon.
 - If the text that follows the bullet point is not a proper sentence, it does not need to start with a capital letter and end with a full stop <u>BUT</u> you must be consistent throughout the bullet pointed list.
- ✓ If commas or semicolons are used at the end of bullet points, then a full stop must end the last bullet point.
- ✓ If the text that follows the bullet point is a complete sentence, it should begin with a capital letter and end with a full stop.
