ADVERBIAL PHRASES, DO words forming a single piece of information - it does not contain a subject or a verb and is a part of a sentence.

An adverbial clause does contain a subject and a verb.

Examples of adverbs

The children run **quickly Suddenly**, the bus came to a halt. You can take a prize now.

Examples of adverbial phrases

The children sat in silence.

At the end of the school day, some children go to afterschool clubs.

It's difficult for parents to park their cars anywhere near the school.

Examples of adverbial clauses

Keep beating the drum until I tell you to stop. During a day that was packed with activities, the children had the opportunity to try many new things. I don't have a bank account as I'm not old enough yet.



Adverbials appearing at the start of a sentence are known as fronted adverbials.
