A hyphen is used to join two or more words, or to join some prefixes to words.

A hyphen is shorter than a dash and does not have a space on either side of it. It 'glues' two or more words, or some prefixes and a word, together.

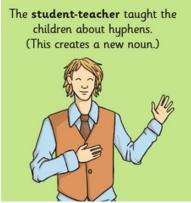
When you should use a hyphen.... with examples...

prefix combinations




