

When a sentence is written in the **active voice**, the **subject** of the sentence is the performer (the 'doer') of an action:





The object of the sentence is the 'receiver' of the action.

Here, the focus of the sentence is the cats.

When a sentence is written in the **passive voice**, the **receiver** of the action becomes the subject.








The **performer** (the 'doer') of the action becomes the object.

Here, the focus of the sentence is the mice.





The cake was baked by Mrs.Carroll.

The window was broken. <u>OR</u> The window was broken by the children. (*The preposition 'by'* is often a hint.)
