of words that does not make sense on its own.
Usually, it does not contain a verb.

CEXPANDEN SE PHRASE

A noun phrase tells you what the noun is and gives you more information about it, e.g.

The black cat under the car is scared of the dog.

An adverbial phrase describes the verb (using an adverb) and provides extra information about how the action is taking place, e.g. The teacher asked for everyone to be seated as quickly as possible.

A preposition phrase

includes the preposition, plus the noun, pronoun or noun phrase, e.g.

The mouse ran along the windowsill.
