your

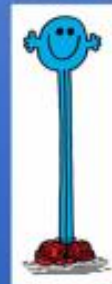
shows possession of something

pronoun used to identify a person or thing



Which pet is yours?

## witch

female sorcerer or magician



There was a witch sat on a broom.

## whose

possessive pronoun used to find out which person something belongs to



Whose treasure is that?

## who's

a contraction of who is



Who's that dolphin?

## affect

indicates influence on someone or something



What we eat can affect our health.

## effect

a change that is produced by an action



Some chemicals have a harmful effect on the environment.

## buy

to purchase something



I want to buy some sweets.

## bye

short for goodbye



Bye, see you tomorrow.

## by

used for saying how something is done



I am getting there by train.

## weather

the rain, snow, wind, sunshine etc. at a particular time



The weather changes regularly in this country.

## whether

used to show a choice or doubt between two possibilities



I don't know whether to believe it or not.

## whole

this means entire, complete, or unbroken



There is a whole cake there.

## hole

a gap, opening or something hollow



There is a hole in that doughnut.

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
